Strategic Planning Initiative

Town of Ocean City employees and policy makers worked diligently this year on a new strategic planning initiative that will be used as the city's "foundation," according to City Manager David Recor. Recor, who made the initiative one of his immediate goals upon becoming city manager last June, believes that the strategic planning endeavor will build a consensus and develop unity in the organization and the council.

As part of the strategic planning process, which was approved by the City Council last summer, Lyle Sumek of Lyle Sumek Associates, Inc., spent several days meeting with Town of Ocean City employees, department heads and Mayor and Council members. During these meetings, which included individual interviews, a tour of the city and its infrastructure and an outline of successes and challenges both past and present, data was collected to establish a priority list for 2013, as well as 15 years into the future.

Another vital part of the strategic planning development included a series of workshops with department heads and staff, as well as elected officials. During a citizen summit, held on January 31, 2013, nearly 75 residents and business owners participated in the strategic planning process by giving feedback to the Mayor and Council on the strategic plan draft.

At that time, the feedback from citizens and staff was used to create the one-year aspects of the strategic plan.

The final strategic plan, which is expected to be completed during the spring of 2013, will include a 15-year mission statement and vision, as well as a five-year plan which will be developed and updated annually. "I am very excited to see the progress we have made through the strategic planning process," said Recor. "Our employees, elected officials and citizens were engaged in the process from the beginning, which I think will result in a great working document that will move Ocean City forward in a very positive direction."

Outdoor Exercise & Fitness Area at Northside Park

The Town of Ocean City is thrilled to announce the opening of the new outdoor exercise and fitness area at Northside Park. In June 2012, the Town was awarded a \$119,000 grant from the Maryland Department of Natural Resources' Community Parks & Playgrounds Program, which was used to construct the facility.

The new outdoor exercise and fitness area can be found at Northside Park, next to a recently renovated ADA-accessible playground. "This is the first outdoor exercise area in Ocean City's



parks," said Tom Shuster, Recreation and Parks Director. "This area will allow individuals and small groups to build fitness in a public setting without having to pay a fee or membership. It also will allow the Town of Ocean City to offer a variety of new outdoor exercise and fitness programs here at Northside Park."

The Recreation and Parks Department, in conjunction with the Town of Ocean City's Grants Coordinator, were integral in the planning and implementation of the new facility. "This project brings the 'best of the gym' to the beautiful out-



doors at Northside Park," continued Shuster. "We are thrilled to offer an area in Ocean City that will bring teams, friends and families together to improve their personal health and fellowship."



Boardwalk Reconstruction Project Wraps Up

The Town of Ocean City will complete the reconstruction of our famous boardwalk this spring. The new boardwalk has a stronger structure to allow heavier vehicles and fire trucks to ride the entire length of the boards. From North Division to 27th Street, the boardwalk will also use a new deck board pattern to identify the train lane.

The Ocean City boardwalk is 11,857 feet long, the reconstruction project used over 100,000 pieces of lumber and over 1.5 million nails. Much of the old boardwalk material was recycled as distressed wood siding or used for to make farm fences. Some was sold to local craftsmen and you will find it used in many creative ways in shops around Ocean City. The total cost of the project is \$6 million.

Phase One, which ran from 27th Street to 15th Street was completed last spring and built by RBCI Construction out of Easton, Maryland. Phase Two of the project, from 15th Street to Somerset Street began on October 12th with and will be complete this May. Phase Two is being built by Rehak Contracting out of Baltimore, Maryland.

Roland E. Powell Convention Center Facelift — Phase I Complete

The Roland E. Powell Convention Center recently received a facelift, with the completion of the first phase of the Convention Center's renovation project. The new space, the Bay Front Ballroom and Trimper Dockside Exhibit Hall, boasts floor-to-ceiling windows overlooking the beautiful bay.

Construction for the improvement project began during the spring of 2011 and was completed during the fall of 2012. In an effort to expand, enhance and embrace the surrounding splendor Mother Nature has provided, the new Bay Front Ballroom was designed to give visitors 34,600 square feet of dazzling space, including panoramic views of the bay.

In addition to the new ballroom, the new Trimper Dockside Exhibit Hall will replace the old Trimper Hall or Hall C.



The newer hall offers 76,235 square feet of exhibit venue on the first floor level and is complemented by the same beautiful view that the ballroom patrons will enjoy on level two.

The new Trimper Dockside Exhibit Hall, combined with the existing Exhibit Halls "A" and "B," allows the Convention Center to offer dedicated exhibit space for up to 375 trade show booths. Along with the new views, the Roland E. Powell



Convention Center boasts 22 meeting rooms and is designed to accommodate gatherings of 20 people to 280 people, theater style. Guests of the Convention Center also enjoy free parking for 1,200 cars, full service catering in house by Centerplate and a full service event management staff who accommodate the needs of every visitor.

Phase Two of the project, which consists of construction of a 1,200-seat performing arts auditorium, will begin in the fall of 2013 and is expected to be complete by December 2014. This exciting project will replace the Convention Center's existing state, the first-floor exhibit hall and a portion of the second-floor ballroom. With two-tiers of fixed seating and the completion of phase two, the addition of the performing arts auditorium is expected to attract major shows, concerts, plays and other performances.

Golf Digest Ranks Eagle's Landing Amongst Top Courses in Maryland

Nearly 75 employees from the Town of Ocean City and several allied agencies recently returned from a training opportunity of a lifetime. The prestigious Integrated Emergency Man-




agement Course, which is hosted by The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), offered select participants the chance to take part in training that most communities nationwide will never have the privilege of experiencing.

The FEMA funded training took participants through several phases of the emergency management process, including executing plans, implementing policies and developing procedures to protect life and property during simulated disaster situations. "This training opportunity was a rare opportunity for Town of Ocean City employees and our allied agencies to practice

working together during a disaster situation," said Joseph Theobald, Director of Emergency Services for the Town of Ocean City. "FEMA tailored the training to fit our community, which helped us test our community emergency plans, identify where we need to improve and

clarify our roles and responsibilities in the event of a disaster."

The community specific training challenged participants to use new ideas, skills, abilities and their own knowledge and experience to rehearse real-life roles in a realistic emergency situation. The training, which was



"This experience will not only benefit the employees who attended, but will benefit the community as a whole," Theobald said. "We have a responsibility to prepare for, respond to, recover from and mitigate disaster. This training opportunity provided us an

exceptional opportunity to continue our high standard of readiness and ability to function effectively for the Ocean City community in a time of crisis."

New Caroline Street Comfort Station & Stage Under Construction

In addition to our renovated Boardwalk, construction of a new Comfort Station and Stage facility at Caroline Street and the Boardwalk is underway and will be completed this May. The new building incorporates green technology such as high efficiency lighting and a unique system that uses a combination of chimneys and underground pipes to ventilate the building. Restroom facilities have been expanded and are fully accessible. The stage includes a private dressing room and will provide a permanent location for concerts and entertainment on the beach all summer long.



Ocean City Fire Department Awarded \$383,325 from the Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program

The Ocean City Fire Department, founded in 1905, has received grant funding through the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) program. The highly competitive federal grant program's primary goal is to meet the firefighting and emergency response needs

of fire departments and non-affiliated emergency medical service organizations. Since 2001, the AFG has helped fire-fighters and other first responders to obtain critically needed equipment, protective gear, emergency vehicles, training, and

other resources needed to protect the public and emergency personnel from fire and related hazards.

Supported by both of Maryland's U.S. Senators, Senator Mikulski and Senator Cardin, the Ocean City Fire Department will use the \$383,325 grant funding to purchase more than 50 self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA), and 6 Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) packs. It was during a series of departmental strategic planning meetings that the OCFC determined the systemic replacement of pre-1997, noncompliant SCBA equipment, and accompanying RIT bags was the Department's most pressing need. With this federal FY 2012 AFG grant award, that safety issue will be addressed.

With a primary response area of 10.5 miles, the OCFD is a combination department of 222 members including, the

Office of the Fire Marshal, and EMS staff. The Department responds to over 9000 calls for service annually, including CBRNE, HAZMAT, and it provides mutual aid to both Worcester County, MD, and Sussex County, DE. Ocean City's firefighters have handled in excess of 350 suppression fires over the last three years.

Upon procurement of the much needed SCBA equipment, the overall effectiveness of the OCFD will improve daily operations. Areas of improvement will include firefighter safety, standardized training, increased operational readiness, and incident risk reduction. With the purchase, the community's \$10.2 billion of real property assets and in excess of 8 million visitors will be better protected, not to mention the improved life safety of our first responders.



Receive City Wide Alerts from Town of Ocean City Via Text, Email, RSS & Social Media

In an effort to keep citizens better informed, the Town of Ocean City offers a service, known as GovDelivery, to disseminate timely, accurate and essential information. Used by over 450 government agencies, GovDelivery is an automated system that uses email, text messaging, RSS and social media to notify citizens about specific topics of interest.

"GovDelivery dramatically increases the number of people that the Town of Ocean City can reach directly," said David Recor, City Manager for the Town of Ocean City. "Not only does this program streamline communication, but more importantly, it helps us continue to effectively communicate with our residents, businesses owners and visitors."

In addition to city wide alerts, citizens can choose to subscribe to a number of Town of Ocean City topics, including government related news, tourism updates and recreation and parks programs and special events. The service, which is FREE for citizens, also allows users to create a profile in which they can create and change their preferences at any time.

Spring Clean Up & Yard Sale

The Town of Ocean City is once again offering a great opportunity for residential property owners to do their spring-cleaning by offering free residential bulk pick-up on Saturday and Sunday, April 13–14, 2013. As an added attraction, Ocean City will also offer a Community Yard Sale on Saturday, April 13, 2013 at Northside Park.

Ocean City's bulk pick-up service offers a convenient way for residents to get rid of large household items, such as furniture, appliances, bicycles, carpet, etc., which cannot normally be loaded into a standard refuse truck. Normally, this service does not include building materials, yard debris, etc. However, during the Spring Clean Up the town will be accepting these items.

Place your items curbside (staff does not go on private property to remove items) on Friday, April 12, for Saturday April 13 pick-up from 6am to 2pm and Sunday, April 14 pick-up from 6am to 1pm. The Town is providing bulk pick-up free of charge during this period. At other times, cost for bulk pick-up is \$15 per pick-up of one item, \$25 for up to three items and \$5 for each additional item. There will also be an amnesty program to collect fireworks, old ammunition and old weapons that residents may have in their household and need to be removed. As part of the Spring Clean Up, OC's 12th annual Community Yard Sale will be held on Saturday, April 13, 2013 from 7am-noon at Northside Park's parking lot on 125th Street in front of the Community Center. Beach Patrol Educates the Public

When people think about the Ocean City Beach Patrol Surf Rescue Technicians (SRTs/lifeguards), they picture them

perched atop their white stands, sending semaphore, blowing their whistles, and running down the beach with orange rescue buoys. Although all of these activities are important parts of their three-part mission; education, prevention and intervention, the Beach Patrol spends the majority of its time and efforts on the first aspect of this mission; which is education.

One program the beach patrol started about fifteen years ago is the weekly beach safety presentation. Every Sunday morning, in different locations along the entire Ocean City shoreline, beach patrons can listen to a beach safety

presentation given by members of the OCBP and receive safety related give-aways.

OCBP lifeguards also frequently do what are called "EDU"s. This is the semaphore abbreviation for "Education." An EDU is when a lifeguard recognizes a potential hazard or dangerous circumstance (rip current, heavy surf, etc.) and gets a group of beach patrons together to warn them about the hazard. The idea is that if the public is well informed they will make better decisions, which will result in a safer beach environment for everyone. Each SRT is trained in public speaking and presenting EDUs during the required 65-hour Surf Rescue Training Academy.

Springfest Welcomes the Season! May 2nd-5th

Ocean City celebrates the start of the season with the 23rd Annual Springfest, the 4-day festival filled with arts and crafts, live entertainment and delicious food from May 2nd–5th. Springfest is located in the Inlet Lot at the south end of Ocean City's famous Boardwalk.

With a continuous variety of musical performances on two stages, Springfest is fun for people of all ages. Admission to the 4-day event is FREE, including all entertainment, with the exception of the headline acts.

One of this year's headlining acts is Foreigner, a British-American band formed in 1976 by Englishman, Mick Jones in NYC. **Foreigner** will take the stage at 8pm on Saturday. Their debut album, "Foreigner" sold over 4 million copies and produced such hits as "Feels Like the First Time" and "Cold As Ice." Throughout the 1970s they had continued hits with "Double Vision," "Head Games" and "Hot Blooded." In the 80s, Foreigner continued to dominate the charts with songs "Waiting for a Girl Like you," "Juke Box Hero," "Urgent" and "I Want To Know What Love Is."

With a career spanning over 30 years, Foreigner continues to tour and release new music. Foreigner has had 16 Top 30 hits and sold more than 70 million albums. The album, "Foreigner 4" spent more weeks at #1 on the Billboard chart than any other artist in Atlantic Records history, including Led Zeppelin and The Rolling Stones. Their music continues to get airplay on popular and classic rock radio. Tickets are \$27 to \$59.

Country music sensation, **Justin Moore** will also be performing as a headliner this year. Taking the stage on Friday, Moore will be showcasing his #1 hits, such as "Small Town USA" and "If Heaven Wasn't So Faraway." Since arriving in 2008, the Arkansas native has stayed on the charts with many other hits including, "Bait a Hook," "Backwoods" and "Til My Last Day." His songs reflect his smalltown, southern upbringing, mixing traditional and hard-rocking country music. Moore has toured with the biggest names in country music, including Rascal Flatts and Brad Paisley gaining loyal fans along the way. Tickets are \$25 to \$45.

Also at Springfest, **Beatlemania Again** will perform at 7pm on Thursday. Their performance chronologically traces the Beatles from their debut on the Ed Sullivan Show in 1964, to the psychedelic

Town of Ocean City Ordinance Information

In Ocean City, we take safety very seriously. After all, we want everyone to have a pleasurable, safe, and fun vacation. Millions of visitors travel to Ocean City each summer, so it's important that vacationers and residents are mindful of our highway laws. There are bus/bike lanes on both sides of Coastal Highway to support flow of traffic, however; citizens may not park or drive in these lanes unless making a right turn.

• Pedestrians & Bicyclists

Remember to be alert for pedestrians and bicyclists when entering or leaving the highway. Motorists must yield right-of-way to pedestrians crossing the street at a crosswalk, at any controlled intersection when obeying the traffic signals, and at any non-signaled intersection.


• Bicycles on Roadways

Also, bicyclists must obey the same traffic laws as motorists and may receive citations for failure to obey these rules of the road. The most common violations committed by bicyclists are riding against the flow of traffic in the bike lane and failing to obey traffic signals.

Other Ordinances

Additional ordinances to be mindful of include: alcoholic beverages, bicycles on the boardwalk, roller stakes/blades, boat trailers, noise ordinance, parking, pets, RV and Oversized parking, sleeping, surf fishing and surfing.

— Flood Hazard Protection in Ocean City —

All property in Ocean City is in a flood hazard area & subject to flooding from the ocean, coastal bays & heavy rainfall. Minor flooding is not uncommon & major flooding happens occasionally.

FEMA places properties in flood zones based on their chance of flooding. Property owners can find their property's flood hazard designation by contacting the Dept. of Planning & Community Development, 410-289-8855, *kbrown@ocean citymd.gov*, or City Engineer, 410-289-8845, *tmcgean@oceancitymd.gov*.

Natural & Beneficial Functions of Floodplains: Floodplains in their natural state provide many beneficial functions. Primary undeveloped flood plain areas in Ocean City are beaches & dunes, the first line of defense against flood damage from the ocean. Taking care of dunes by not walking in them & maintaining vegetation is essential to retaining their flood protection function.

Bayside, wetlands & other open spaces act as sponges, storing floodwaters before they reach upland areas. These natural areas are protected by Federal, State & local regulations.

Flood Warning System: Ocean City has developed a flood warning system as part of our Emergency Operations Plan. Since flooding here is caused by storms & hurricanes, the warning system is based on storm severity & location.

Flood Insurance: Standard homeowners insurance policies do not cover losses due to flooding. Ocean City participates in the National Flood Insurance Program, which makes federally backed flood insurance available to property owners. This insurance is required in many cases, such as

when property is purchased with a federally backed mortgage. Property owners can insure buildings & contents against flood damage, & renters can insure possessions. Condominiums should carry a flood insurance policy on the structure itself.

Floodplain Development Permit Requirements: Ocean City Code requires a building permit be obtained for nearly all construction and structural repair work. The city reviews plans to be sure buildings are constructed to withstand flooding. Permits are also required before any land development (grading, filling, etc.) in the floodplain to ensure activities do not increase flooding potential on or around property.

Part of the permit process involves preparation of elevation certificates, which provide a record of the structure's lowest floor elevation to predicted flood levels. Elevation certificates are maintained for review by insurance agents, property owners & other interested persons. Obtain information and permits from Dept. of Planning & Community Development at City Hall (410-289-8855, kbrown@oceancitymd.gov). Illegal floodplain activity can also be reported here.

Drainage System Maintenance: It is important our drainage system be kept clear of obstructions & debris. The town's littering ordinance prohibits throwing trash onto any public property, including storm drains and sewers.

To report violations and clogged drainage ways, call 410-524-7716.

Flood Protection Assistance: The Dept. of Planning & Community Development & City Engineer

can assist with questions about flood protection & flood insurance, including historical flooding information so you can relate flood potential to your property; site visits to advise appropriate flood protection techniques; review retrofitting plans; locate property on flood insurance rate maps to determine flood zones & research elevation certificates for existing buildings to determine height above floodwaters. Property Protection Measures

There are many ways to protect property from flood damage. Make sure your new building is constructed to meet or exceed code requirements. These include requirements for elevation of building, foundations, venting, etc.

There are also ways to retrofit existing buildings to increase protection:

• **ELEVATION:** Raising structure to bring it above floodwater level.

• LEVEES: In areas of shallow flooding with low velocity, a levee can be built around the structure.

•FLOOD WALLS: Similar to levees, but built of materials such as masonry block or reinforced concrete to keep floodwa-

• CLOSURES: Involve techniques for protecting gaps left open for daily convenience, such as walks, doors, driveways.
• SEALANTS: Can be applied to walls & floors to keep water from penetrating.

from penetrating.

•UTILITY PROTECTION: Flooding sometimes causes costly damage to utility systems. By elevating utilities or shielding them, flooding can be avoided. Moving utilities to less flood-prone locations can also minimize damage.
