## A WORLD OF ART IN OC

Experience a world of art at the area's newest cultural amenity—the Ocean City Center for the Arts. Located on 94th Street, just next to the water tower bearing its logo, this state-of-the-art facility is the home of the Art League of Ocean City, the area's non-profit arts organization. Dedicated to promoting the visual arts in the Ocean City area, the Art League recently celebrated its 50th year anniversary. In March of 2013, the new building opened through a partnership with the Town of Ocean City, State of Maryland and Worcester County. Since then it has become a place where people come together to create, explore, experience and connect through the arts.

Step inside the building and be inspired by the gorgeous blown glass chandelier. Containing over 100 pieces of colored glass and measuring 9 feet tall and 6 feet wide, it is the centerpiece of the gallery spaces. Be inspired as you view the exhibits of original art by local and regional artists in multiple gallery spaces. Many of the works are available for sale and provide an ideal way to take home a lasting Ocean City memory.

Drop in and take an art class. Choose from a variety of classes for all ages and levels. Class subjects range from drawing and painting, to photography, fiber arts, pottery and much more. Visit the artist studios to see work in progress, and stop by the gift shop to buy local and support the arts. Purchase original artisan works including a great selection of jewelry, blown glass, pottery and paintings at affordable prices.

The OC Center for the Arts is open 11am–4pm daily, year round and admission is free. Exhibitions change monthly and the public is always invited to the opening receptions 5–7pm on the first Friday of the month. Come by to preview



the artwork, meet the artists and enjoy complimentary refreshments. It's a great start to your evening on the town.

Be sure to stop by the Ocean City Visitor's Center, located at the Convention Center on 40th Street and the Ocean City Chamber of Commerce on Rt. 50, to see additional displays of original artwork by Art League members.

## OC PERFORMING ARTS CENTER TO BE COMPLETED FALL 2014

Construction on the new 1,200 seat performing arts center in the Roland E. Powell Convention Center is currently underway, with a completion date set for the fall of 2014. With the ability to host concerts, shows, theater productions and plays, the new performing art center is expected to attract a variety of new events and audiences.

The state-of-the-art theater features two tiers of fixed seating, including 850 seats on the first floor and another 350 in a second-floor balcony. The new arena will replace the convention center's existing stage, the first-floor exhibit hall and a portion of the second-floor ballroom.



The performing arts center is the second phase of the convention center improvement project, which began in the spring of 2011. The first phase was completed last year, boasting floor-to-ceiling windows overlooking the water in the new Bayfront Ballroom and Trimper Dockside Exhibit Hall. The new space gives visitors over 110,000 square feet of dazzling space, including panoramic views of the bay.

# NEW BEACH PATROL BUILDING



The Ocean City Beach Patrol will have a new home next year, as preliminary designs have been approved for the life-guard's new headquarters. The three-story building will be located at the corner of Talbot Street and Philadelphia

Avenue, which is across the street from its existing location on three parcels purchased by the Ocean City Development Corporation (OCDC). The land parcels are currently a gravel parking lot next to the OCDC's office.

The new headquarters represents a traditional Ocean City aesthetic as laid out by OCDC's Downtown Design Standards, with a total of 10,000 square feet of space. The new building provides facilities for beach patrol vehicle and equipment storage, training, roll call, dispatch and administrative areas. The multi-purpose training and roll call room will be available for public use during the off season. The Police Department Bicycle Unit will also be housed on the first floor.

The town has budgeted two million dollars funded through municipal bonds for this project and construction is scheduled to begin in September 2014.

## Flood Hazard Protection in Ocean City

All property in Ocean City is in a flood hazard area & subject to flooding from the ocean, coastal bays & heavy rainfall. Minor flooding is not uncommon & major flooding happens occasionally. FEMA places properties in flood zones based on their chance of flooding. Property owners can find their property's flood hazard designation by contacting the Department of Planning & Community Development, 410.289.8855, kbrown@oceancitymd.gov, or City Engineer, 410.289.8845, tmcgean@oceancitymd.gov.

**Natural & Beneficial Functions of Floodplains:** Floodplains in their natural state provide many beneficial functions. Primary undeveloped flood plain areas in Ocean City are beaches & dunes, the first line of defense against flood damage from the ocean. Taking care of dunes by not walking on them & maintaining vegetation is essential to retaining their flood protection function.

Byside, wetlands & other open spaces act as sponges, storing floodwaters before they reach upland areas. These natural areas are protected by Federal, State & local regulations.

**Flood Warning System:** Ocean City has developed a flood warning system as part of our new Emergency Operations Plan. Since flooding here is caused by storms & hurricanes, the warning system is based on storm severity & location.

**Flood Insurance:** Standard homeowners insurance policies do not cover losses due to flooding. Ocean City participates in the National Flood Insurance Program, which makes federally backed flood insurance available to property owners. This insurance is required in many cases, such as when property is purchased with a federally backed mortgage. Property owners can insure buildings & contents against flood damage & renters can insure possessions. Condominiums should carry

a flood insurance policy on the structure itself. Flood insurance is available to all property owners & renters.

### Floodplain Development Permit Requirements:

Ocean City Code requires a building permit be obtained for nearly all construction & structural repair work, & for any development within the Special Flood Hazard Area mapped on the Flood Insurance Rate Maps. The city reviews plans to be sure buildings are constructed to withstand flooding. Permits are also required before any land development (grading, filling, etc.) in the floodplain to ensure activities do not increase flood-potential on or around property.

Part of the permit process involves preparation of elevation certificates, which provide a record of the structure's lowest floor elevation to predicted flood levels. Elevation certificates are maintained for review by insurance agents, property owners & other interested persons. Obtain information & permits from Department of Planning & Community Development at City Hall 410.289.8855, kbrown@oceancitymd.gov. Illegal floodplain activity can also be reported here.

**Drainage System Maintenance:** It is important our drainage system be kept clear of obstructions & debris. The town's littering ordinance prohibits throwing trash onto any public property, including storm drains & sewers. To report violations & clogged drainage ways, call 410.524.7716.

**Flood Protection Assistance:** The Dept. of Planning & Community Development & City Engineer can assist with questions about flood protection & flood insurance, including historical flooding information so you can relate flood potential to your property; site visits to advise appropriate flood protection techniques; review retrofitting plans; locate property on flood insurance rate maps to determine flood zones & research

elevation certificates for existing buildings to determine height above floodwaters. For more information, call 410.289.8855 or email kbrown@oceancitymd.gov.

### — Property Protection Measures —

There are many ways to protect property from flood damage. Make sure your new building is constructed to meet or exceed code requirements. These include requirements for elevation of building, foundations, venting, etc. There are also ways to retrofit existing buildings to increase protection:

- **ELEVATION:** Raising structure to bring it above flood-water level.
- **LEVEES:** In areas of shallow flooding with low velocity, a levee can be built around the structure.
- **FLOOD WALLS:** Similar to levees, but built of materials such as masonry block or reinforced concrete to keep flood water away.
- **CLOSURES:** Involve techniques for protecting gaps left open for daily convenience, such as walks, doors, driveways.
- **SEALANTS:** Can be applied to walls & floors to keep water from penetrating.
- **UTILITY PROTECTION:** Flooding sometimes causes costly damage to utility systems. By elevating utilities or shielding them, flooding can be avoided. Moving utilities to less flood-prone locations can also minimize damage.



## Dramatic Decrease in Pedestrian, Bicycle, Scooter Collisions

Ocean City has seen dramatic decreases this year in three motor vehicle collisions categories, including pedestrian collisions, which decreased by 41 percent compared to 2012. Further, there were zero fatalities in 2013 as a result of any motor vehicle collision in Ocean City.

According to police, the significant decrease is largely attributed to the "Walk Smart" campaign. The revamped campaign, which focuses on enforcement, education and engineering, was implemented in May 2013 in cooperation with the state, town and many other community partners.

In addition to pedestrian collisions, a large emphasis was placed on educating citizens of bicycle safety tips. The "Walk Smart" campaign was paired with a "Ride Smart" message specific to cyclists explaining the rules of the road. Scooter collisions also saw a big dip in 2013, dropping 65 percent. This drop is due in large part to new registration and insurance requirements for motor scooters that went into effect on January 1, 2013.

While these dramatic decreases in collisions show great success, efforts will continue to be made to educate citizens and provide safety tips. The OCPD, State Highway Administration and all of the community partners are dedicated to keeping the number of collisions down and decreasing the numbers even further.

## New Caroline Street Comfort Station & Stage Completed

Construction of the new Caroline Street Comfort Station and Stage was completed this winter. The new building incorporates green technology such as high efficiency lighting and a unique system that uses a combination of chimneys and underground pipes to ventilate the building. Restroom facilities have been expanded and are fully accessible. The stage includes a private dressing room and will provide a permanent location for concerts and entertainment on the beach all summer long. Despite weather delays and construction challenges, the building is now open and was well worth the wait. It is a wonderful addition to our beautiful Boardwalk.

## New FM Emergency Advisory Radio Station

The Town of Ocean City's Emergency Services Department recently received notification from the Maryland Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) that it has been awarded a hazard mitigation grant to install a new FM emergency advisory radio system. The FEMA sponsored Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) provides grants to states and local governments to implement long-term hazard mitigation measures. The purpose of the HMGP is to reduce the loss of life and property due to natural disasters.

Ocean City's HMGP grant award to install the new low power FM emergency advisory radio system is \$55,000, with a federal share of \$41,250, and a non-federal share of \$13,750. The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has issued construction permits to build and operate a public safety FM broadcast radio station.

A studio will be constructed in the Ocean City Public Safety Building, located at 65th Street and managed by the Emergency Services Department. Pre-recorded and live programming will transmit on WPSB 99.5 FM from the 65th Street radio tower and WWOP 100.3 FM from the Ocean Pines radio tower.

Having a new FM emergency advisory radio system is going to greatly benefit our residents and property owners by providing real time information, including public service announcements, evacuation traffic management, and weather and emergency alerts. Get ready by adding these stations to your FM radio memory for quick access when the roadside alert lights or fire sirens are activated. The AM1670 station you are currently receiving will continue to operate until further notice.

## OC Fire Department Station 4 Gets Temporary New Home

The Ocean City Fire Department's Station 4 has a new place to call home, as demolition began in the fall to the existing building, located at 129th Street and Coastal Highway. Due to the concentration of high-rise structures and year-round residents in the north end of the town, the reconstruction project, which will take place over the next 12 months, has been a priority for the Ocean City Fire Department for years.

With a new home at Northside Park, the OCFD assures residents and visitors that they have strategically planned so that staff and equipment will always be available during this transitional period. At no time will any part of town lack fire or EMS coverage.

The temporary Station 4 building, which is located at 12801 Jamaica Avenue, is adjacent to the Ocean City Recreation and Parks offices. Completion of the new building is slated for the spring of 2015 and will boast 11,500 square feet, increasing the capacity of the engine bay by more than one third. In addition, the new building will provide areas for both duty crews and the departments successful live-in program.

# OCEAN CITY BEACH REPLENISHMENT CONTINUES DURING SPRING 2014 SEASON

In 1994, Maryland, Worcester County and Ocean City accepted responsibility for operation and maintenance of the completed Atlantic Coast of Maryland Storm Protection Project. The project consists of the Beach Renourishment program, dunes, dune crossovers, dune planting and fencing along with the seawall along the boardwalk.

The State of Maryland, Worcester County and Ocean City have a long term written partnership agreement with the Army Corps of Engineers to perform periodic beach renourishment as needed to maintain adequate storm protection. Per this agreement, the Army Corps of Engineers designs and manages the needed renourishment dredging operations and pays for 53 percent of the cost of renourishment.

Maintaining the project takes a tremendous amount of effort from local and state officials. Public Works crews maintain all the items mentioned above and the Office of Engineering keeps constant watch on the project. To make this project successful requires the cooperation of everyone.

The town would also like to remind you that the installation of fencing, landscaping items, decks, planters or any permanent item

is prohibited east of the Construction Limit Line (CLL). The CLL runs parallel with the dunes and is located approximately 10 feet to the west of the westerly toe of the dunes. This area must be kept clear and open for easy access, maintenance and monitoring purposes. It can be easily located at your property by measuring back 10 feet from the sand fencing at the toe of the dune. If you have any questions about where the line is or where you should stop your private fencing, please call City Hall and someone will come out and meet with you.

Also, mid-block crossovers are public property and are for the use of all visitors and residents at the beach. The installation of impediments on these crossovers is prohibited. Any signs, chains, gates, etc. will be removed.

Our beach is here for everyone's enjoyment. Maryland's Beach Replenishment Project protects property and life. To date, the project has prevented an estimated \$770 million in storm damage. Please treat the beach with respect and extend your cooperation to those that are responsible for maintaining it. ## One Man's Trash is Another Man's... Fuel Source

You may recall the old adage, "one man's trash is another man's treasure." Well, in the case of Ocean City, one man's trash is another man's fuel source.

Ocean City currently holds a contract with Covanta 4Recovery, a leader in the field of solid waste management Energy-from-Waste facilities, for trucking and repurposing of the town's Municipal Solid Waste (MSW). Locally, residents and visitors generate roughly 34,000 tons of MSW annually. Historically, the vast majority of that waste was landfilled in Worcester County's central landfill, but that is no longer the case.

Several years ago, the town chose to part ways with the old fashion means of land-filling one's trash and instead chose to make beneficial reuse of the waste for electricity generation. The town still collects the MSW from all residents and businesses, however; once the trash is brought back to the solid waste transfer station, it is loaded in large tractor trailers and departs in route to the Energy Resource Recovery Facility, which is owned and operated by Covanta. That facility, which is located in Fairfax, Virginia, has an annual capacity of nearly 1 million tons of MSW.

At this facility, MSW is used in lieu of fossil fuels to generate

heat and produce steam. The steam is then used to turn turbines that produce electricity. On average, 670 kilowatts of electricity are produced for every one ton of trash that is burned. In the case of the Fairfax County facility, that means they produce enough electricity to annually power 75,000 homes.

For those who recall environmental concerns of the 1960's and 70's, with visions of toxic smoke spewing from the stacks—have no fear! This is not the case anymore. With the current regulatory oversight of such facilities via the Inter-governmental Panel on Climate Change, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the individual States Department of Environments, the industry is now heavily regulated for emissions filtering, limits and controls.

So, that leaves some wondering, "What about the traditional means of recycling?" and "Where does that fit into the overall concept of Energy-from-Waste?" Well, little do many realize that the entire Energy-from-Waste process also includes post incineration metals separation. At the Fairfax facility alone, they recycle enough metal annually to build the equivalent of 20,000 automobiles.

Additionally, the town still recycles white goods, such as washers, dryers, refrigerators, as well as other miscellaneous metals,

Please keep in mind that damaging the dunes in any way is a criminal offense. Only the Department of Natural Resources Contractor is permitted to trim the vegetation. This action is recommended by the Department of Agriculture and will be carried out on an annual basis. To request the dune grass to be trimmed in your area, please contact the Maryland Department of Natural Resources.

while also maintaining a used oil/anti-freeze recycling drop off. So, the next time you wonder where your trash is going, think about two main options: Is it being landfilled, like most county and municipal governments OR is your trash being repurposed as a fuel source to create electricity and reduce our dependency on fossil fuels?
